2. Topic Description #2

Signage

Discussion

Nick Markel could not attend the meeting tonight, but there were many ideas shared.

- Tom talked about using natural colors for the signs
- A discussion about using N-E-S-or W and the possibility of color coding different areas of the building.
- A discussion on maps for Wayfinding ensued.
- Carol recommended we have a very visible map at the reception desk at door 3
- Mike recommended directions be obvious on the map
- Ken said our maps need to be updated
- Matt asked about room sign design /LL signage
- Tom asked about hanging signs for restroom AND EMERGENCY EVACUATION. And also suggested the idea of a compass
- Pat asked for additional thoughts from Nick on the signage, from Nick.
- In our discussion on the signage, the decision was recommended that we eliminate color on the signs and just use the natural tones to fit in better with the nature of the building. We also discussed using veneers and the possibility of piercing the top layer with a light background behind, so that the front of the sign was dark, and the image of the letter, light, as Nick had originally recommended.
- We also discussed NOT using plastic, if possible.
- Tish Note: in rereading all these comments, and after discussing this project with my daughter, who is a wayfinding specialist (Viacollective.com), she highly recommends we bring on a wayfinding consultant to advise us. She gave me points to think about but we are spending a lot of time in "unknown territory." Nick has designed the "Brand" but Wayfinding is another part of this project, that is a different specialty than branding, and therefore I recommend we contact a professional in this field.

3. Topic Description #3

Elevators

Discussion

- Ken provided a document from 3 companies, with cost breakdowns of each.
- Carol proposed that after the last (poor) experience we had with TK, that we should be confronted and consulted for future work, in that they were the least expensive bid.
- Ken proposed more interviewing with TK &MEI.

- Tom recommended we specify a secondary service provider.
- The ACG council recommends we move ahead with the project after a thorough review of the proposals submitted. Final decision on contractor will reside with Parish Director, Pastor, and Director of Operations.

2. Director's Report

Care Centers

- Time has been focused on how servicing those in Care Centers may look different as pandemic restrictions are lifted.
- A guidebook for volunteers who minister at the Care Centers has been developed.
- Staff are meeting with each of the Care Centers to find out what programs and services they are ready for and what that will look like.
- Care Centers have mentioned how appreciative the residents have been of the cards that parishioners have sent.
- Volunteers are excited to get back to ministering at the Care Centers.

Funeral planning

- It has been noticed that family members of their loved ones who have died are planning funeral arrangements months in advance of when they would like to hold the funeral. This is quite different than what had been occurring pre-pandemic.
- Council members should feel free to read articles about trends occurring in funeral arrangements and bring their thoughts and findings to future council meetings.
- Holding funerals on Fridays seem to be trending.

Director's Report continued...

Groups

- 12-Step groups have been invited back to meet at Pax. Currently waiting for a response. Hoping they will be back the 1st week of June.
- Pax is set to host the next Southwest Grief Coalition group. Need to look at what type of hospitality can be provided.

3. How to Onboard New Members:

Discussion

- The C&S Council will be welcoming three new members. The council discussed ways to help make new members feel welcome and what can be done to help make on-boarding for them more comfortable. Some ideas included:
 - Getting together in person to get to know one another.
 - The Leadership Guide has been helpful.
 - Having a current member partner and mentor with a new member has been found to be helpful.
 Carolyn, Marge, and Lisa are willing to mentor the new members.
- Part of the responsibility of the C&S Council is to have a sense of the bigger picture of what Care and Support is supposed to be about and to discern on what God is calling our ministry to do and be in our world today. The Council adopted the *value of Inclusion* at the April meeting and determined the *key challenges* it will be setting out to meet in the coming months. Those include: responding to changing demographics, engaging in effective communication, inspiring service and ministry, and growing vitality through outreach.
- In terms of onboarding new members, Jean asked if current members felt it would be helpful to create a manual specifically geared toward the Care and Support Council. It could include things such as the vision, mission, values, and key challenges. Some brochures could be included from some of the top ministries served by C&S as well as a little background and/or description of each of the ministries it supports. It was also mentioned that the Care and Support Idea proposal form could be put into the manual as well. It would be a place to keep all current efforts being worked on. It could serve as a reference guide not only for new members but as a resource for all members. A target of having something ready by this fall would be nice. An agenda item for the first fall meeting could be to walk through the manual. It was also mentioned that perhaps there might be a place in the Leadership Toolbox within the Pax website as a place to keep the master version.

Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 5:01pm by Mark Chronister, Chair

Approve Last Meeting Minutes: Motion to accept by Dave, seconded by Jeanne, motion passed unanimously.

Community Council Report: Mark reported on the Community Council meeting. Details will be contained in the minutes of the Community Council. It is possible that the June meetings will be in-person rather than remote. Discussions have been initiated about conducting a 40th anniversary celebration for Pax Christi.

Action Item: All

Finance Council members should provide to Mark thoughts and suggestions regarding the four questions that were listed in the April 21 meeting minutes.

Monthly Financial Review: Renee reviewed the March financial statements, and all was in order.

Sue informed us that April regular contributions were almost \$64,000 less than budget primarily because of limited attendance at the Easter weekend on-site masses, due to Covid restrictions.

Accounts Receivable is the accumulated Employee Retention Tax Credits receivable. The remaining 2021 credits of approximately \$101,000 should be received in the next few months, but the amended 2020 credits will likely be received much later.

Investment Review: Prior to our meeting Jeff sent out a recap of investments for our review. Jeff reported that the April monthly return for Stonebridge was 0.43%, and the April monthly return for Vanguard was 5.73%. As a result of the Vanguard return, the mix of equities to total investments has exceeded our 45% target, and therefore, \$20,000 was transferred to Stonebridge fixed income accounts.

Action Item: Jeff will call an investment committee meeting to develop a recommendation for a minimum equities investment target percent (floor).

Jeff added the endowment fund to the spreadsheet he provides for monthly investment reporting.

Budget: Carol reported that she and Fr. Mike are proposing that bonuses be paid to staff as recognition of their extra time and effort to maintain operations during the pandemic. The proposal is that each bonus be \$1,000 (prorated for

those who have been with Pax Christi for less than a full year). Motion to approve Carol and Fr. Mike's proposal by Jeanne, seconded by Renee, motion passed unanimously.

Sue walked the council through details of the proposed budget. Motion to approve the proposed budget by Jeff, seconded by Jerry, motion passed unanimously. The budget will be presented to the Community Council in June.

Covid Relief: Sue informed us that we have claimed about \$373,045 in credits so far, and we will be eligible for about another \$14,275 in credits on the June 4th payroll. We have received \$216,075, and we will receive about another \$171,245. None of this money will need to be repaid.

Council Member Recruiting: Mark informed us that 4 people have agreed to join the Finance and Development Council: Sandy Towey, Lindsey Perkins, Jay Jensen and Bill Kozik. Mark met in person with three of these new members. One of the new members will serve for 2 years, and the remaining three new members will serve for 3 years; the four new members will be asked to discern among themselves who will take the 2-year term.

Old/New Business.

- 1) Mark recommends we use (spend down or transfer to another account) some of the Stonebridge 10% reserve funds. Because we didn't need to use these funds during the pandemic, it is unlikely we need to continue reserving the entire amount.
- 2) Jeanne has agreed to chair the Finance and Development council for the 2021-2022 year. All congratulated Jeanne and thanked Mark for his exceptional service. Jeanne will attend the June Community Council meeting with Mark.
- 3) Mark is planning to have an in-person gathering at his house this summer for council members and their significant others. He will provide schedule and logistics later.

Adjournment: There being no further business, motion to adjourn by Dave, seconded by Jeanne, motion passed unanimously.

Thirteen Grants were renewed and two new recipients, Cristo Rey and the Link.




