A NOTE FROM FR BILL MURTAUGH



To laugh often and much; to win the respect of intelligent people and the affection of children...to leave the world a little better, whether by a healthy child, a garden patch, or a redeemed social condition; to know even one life has breathed easier because you have lived. This is the meaning of success. —Ralph Waldo Emerson

Alan Naiman lived a very frugal life; he wore old shoes held together by duct tape, bought his clothing at a grocery store, drove jalopies into the ground, and ate at cheap restaurants. He never married or had any children—but kids were important to him. He fostered a few children and cared for his brother, Daniel, who had developmental disabilities. Friends said that "Daniel's struggles" colored the way he looked at life. He left a career in banking to become a social worker for the State of Washington. But when Alan Naiman died in January of 2018 at the age of 63, he left behind an estate valued at \$11 million—most of which he bequeathed to charities helping abandoned, impoverished, sick, and disabled children. Naiman built his fortune by squirreling away most of his \$67,200 salary, working side jobs, and saving the millions he inherited from his parents. The few close friends who knew the extent of his savings said that his scrimping and saving were more a hobby than a sacrifice. His one splurge; after his brother died, Naiman bought himself a Scion FR-S sports car.

When he was diagnosed with cancer, Naiman began researching charities to include in his will. Beneficiaries include a pediatric interim care center and an organization that provides essential services to children in foster care. His executor recalls how excited Naiman was to think about how much good his money would do: "My gift is going to be bigger than their annual budget. It's going to blow them away!" And it did.

The extraordinary life of Alan Naiman challenges us to ask ourselves what Jesus says of his own life and work: "For this purpose I have come" (John 12:27). What is *our* purpose? Why did God give us this life, in this time and in this place? How do we go about realizing the meaning of this gift God has given us? As Alan Naiman's life testifies, the "purpose" of our lives is probably not the grand or impressive or lofty; we may well realize our "purpose" in simple kindness, ready support, and patient understanding to others.

In such humble simplicity, may we bring the goodness of God to those we meet on the journey of life.
