A NOTE FROM FR BILL MURTAUGH

Before I forget...

Many people say that they would be willing to believe in God if evil did not exist. But evil does exist as something too close to home at times. On Friday, April 18, the local news reported two horrifying stories, both involving children.



The first story told of a man who went to the Mall of America "looking for someone to kill," before throwing a five-year-old boy over a third-floor railing, shocking every person with a conscience and a sense of morality and human decency.

The second story involved a father in Big Lake who set his home on fire while his four children were inside. Two of the children, ages one and two, died in the fire. The two older children survived, at least physically. The father later died at HCMC as a result of the fire.

Our hearts and prayers go out to both of these families as they deal with the reality of what is horrible and savage. One family will bury three people—two young children and their father who caused their deaths. The other family waits as their son, Landen, remains in critical condition at Children's Hospital. The family's attorney said Landen "with the grace of God and excellent support and care, is beginning the long, long journey to recovery." He also said, "The family appreciates the outpouring of support from across the country, reassuring them of the overall goodness of humanity and God's will."

From its beginning, the Hebrew scriptures have wrestled with the issue of evil, and the Christian perspective sheds light on the problem, without pretending to have answers for all our questions. The light of God shines in the darkness of human life, and we call it faith, which means we come to see things the way God sees them. Proverbs reminds us, "Without a vision the people perish," and the Christian faith gives us a vision and energy to face up to evil and tragedy rather than do nothing.

God is a mystery, who simply IS, and is not to be explained. I do not believe that the evil committed is "God's will." We are created with "free will" and we make either loving, healthy decisions, or we decide to make poor, and even evil decisions. Human beings do not always act as persons created in the "image of God."

Alexander Solzhenitsyn tells a story which encapsulates something of the mystery of goodness that underpins and transforms the malice and evil of the world:

One martyr lives alone in a big dilapidated house in Siberia. She is untidy, slovenly, a poor cook, careless of her own meager possessions, and lives on the edge of destitution. She makes no effort to accumulate things, has no fine clothes. She responds to every call for help, whether by digging potatoes for others or sharing her precious turf with them. Misunderstood and derided, she has lost six

children. She keeps a dirty white goat, a disabled cat, and some rubber plants. She refuses to get a pig because pigs are destined for slaughter. The

The author reflects that those who had lived side by side with her never understood that she was "that righteous person without whom, as the proverb says, no village can stand, nor any city, not our whole country."
