A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

Dear Friends:

This past week, through a very circuitous set of connections, I was contacted by a religion writer from the Washington Post newspaper. I was recommended to her as someone who might have some insight to share on the culture of Catholic priests



and seminarians that seems to make them unable or unwilling to "speak truth to power"—or to the press—when that is necessary. More specifically, she was wondering why so many victims of emotional and other abuse from their religious superiors in the church don't just come out and speak about that in a public way. It's an important question that I hadn't much reflected upon before, and I found myself not able to be very articulate in my responses...though it is certainly true that this happens. As you know, a number of recent troubling reports about some bishops and the treatment of "their" clergy and seminarians have involved years of secrets kept by people who were too unwilling to say anything about what they had seen, heard, and experienced. Why does that happen and how might it be rectified? Great questions. And the reporter wanted to know if there is something specifically theological as a rationale for this, or whether it's just about the personalities of the people involved.

As I've thought about it more, the theological piece boils down to this: Priests, and to a far, far greater extent seminarians, are completely vulnerable to the dispositions of bishops and others in authority over them. Our Catholic tradition teaches that ordained people are recipients of a call that comes from the Holy Spirit, one that needs to be discerned and tested by a community, especially through a bishop and, by extension, by a seminary. As a practical matter it means that, unlike most other professions or occupations, it is not the case that the demonstrably most expert person in the room is awarded the prize of his ministry. Sometimes God chooses the less evidently able in order to accomplish His will. (St. Paul can tell us a bit about this and has done so.) And sometimes He chooses the one who is not disposed to be the most compliant in his regimen of formation. I refer you once more to St. Paul as Exhibit A. But that also means that, again unlike other professions, there is a greater amount of prayer and subjective judgment that plays in to evaluating the suitability of a seminarian or clergy person. That is as it must be. But sometimes it can threaten to seem almost arbitrary to a candidate for ordination. That creates an incentive to put on the best possible public presentation for the edification of a bishop or professor or pastor. I've seen this more than once. If you cross the wrong person on the ecclesiastical food chain, it can threaten to be the end of your exploration of public ministry. This too I have seen more than once. Many professional lay ministers can speak of something similar. There is fear involved.

It's not a healthy situation, which is why the questions proposed by the reporter this week are very apt. If theology is somehow justifying a manner of being church that inflicts harm to

people, then the theology is bad. It may be worth another look at how we organize things.
